VIII. **Open Discussion Forum (questions/concerns regarding anything said during the meeting)**

A. Rys Corpuz: The current Club of the Year application process is not fair because:

- The fact is the voters "aren't members of clubs" according to today's minutes doesn't make sense when this is something regarding clubs.
- They don't know the impact clubs have on the student population the way the student population does.
- The fact that ASFC people who have interacted with clubs are also able to vote introduces bias in the small voting party.
- There are events from clubs that ICC did not know too well or wasn't a part of:
 - Desi Student Union - Holi
 - Genders and Sexualities Alliance - Clothing Swap
- Short notice should not prevent a school-wide vote because there has been previous voting systems that have been executed in a short notice: but the campus can vote on short notice
 - The Innovation Challenge Vote: 5/29 - 5/30
 - ASFC Board Vote: 4/29 - 5/1

Wanda Furman: I like that idea, Rys. How would that practically work?

Rys Corpuz: We already have a system in place to have a school-wide voting, so it is practical.

Khue Do: The school-wide voting system is too complicated; it's easy for this to become a slippery slope and turn into another Elections, where people hang up posters of their clubs and try to pursue the vote. In addition, ASFC is a lot more tapped-in than one thinks, so they do know what is going on in all the clubs and club events.

Nate Springer: The biggest concern with having ASFC so heavily involved in the decision process for the Club of the Year is because there can easily be biases and unfairness in the decision making.

Daphne Small: I love what I'm hearing and the feedback we are receiving. To have more time to discuss this application process, ICC needs more time. If clubs want to have this award later in the year, like towards the very end of the Spring quarter, we definitely can. The reason why ICC was doing this process quickly was because we wanted the winning club to be recognized at the End of the Year ceremony and at the last ICC meeting. However, if the majority is not happy with the current application process, we would be happy to work with you all to find another process to meet everyone's needs. Contact
