- New Annual Process for ADT Updates: At the April 15th meeting, Evan and Mary shared details about a new process we'll be using to update our ADTs—this includes both state-required updates (i.e., when we need to fill out a new version of the TMC submission form) and optional updates (e.g., adding a newly created course to the degree). The process will take place each fall quarter with a deadline for division curriculum committee approval in mid-November, to allow enough time for approval in the state's system before the next catalog is published. If your department offers an ADT, you'll receive more information about this new process via email; in the meantime, please reach out to Evan and Mary with any questions!
- SLO Framework & Assessment Process: The main topic of discussion at the April 15th meeting was the new SLO Framework & Assessment Process, hot off the presses following recent approval by Academic Senate. While work is being done behind the scenes to incorporate SLOs into the Course Outline of Record form in CourseLeaf, CCC has been tasked with 1. establishing a standard structure for the wording of SLOs, and 2. determining minimum expectations for clarity, measurability, and mapping. Our preliminary discussion focused more on the actual process being put into place, and we plan to direct our attention to these two tasks at the next CCC meeting.
