- Foothill GE Application Criteria for Area 3: At the December 2nd meeting, CCC continued work on refining the criteria for each area of the new Foothill General Education pattern by discussing the criteria and application form for Area 3 Arts and Humanities. The discussion primarily focused on specific language used in some of the depth outcomes, including making edits to provide clarity and updating certain outcomes to be more equity based. The group then discussed the current format of requiring five mandatory outcomes + 2 optional outcomes for each GE application, as well as possibly including an openended question to allow faculty to provide details that don't necessarily map to any of the outcomes. Lastly, the group continued discussing updating the Breadth Criteria and Breadth Mapping for all GE application forms, including the possibility of changing the format for Breath Mapping from multiple questions about individual competencies to a single essay-style question. For more details on what was discussed, we encourage you to reach out to your Curriculum Reps or Ben.

We need your expertise! If your discipline is related to a specific GE area, please join us for our discussion about the criteria for that area, either in person or virtually via Zoom. If you're unable to attend the meeting or would like to provide feedback about an area already discussed, please reach out to your Curriculum Reps or Ben. At our next meeting, on January 20th, we will discuss Area 4 Social and Behavioral Sciences. Once all areas have been discussed and suggested edits compiled, all of the updated application forms will be voted on at CCC.


Lecture Units & Lab Units Fields added to COR: Two new fields have been added to the COR form in CourseLeaf, to help ensure we're in compliance with new Title 5 regulations. For credit courses with both lecture and lab hours, we must now separately specify the units of lecture and lab on our CORs. The important thing to know is that no action is needed on your part! These new fields will be managed by

Mary, who will soon begin updating existing courses to add this info and, moving forward, will enter it on applicable new courses as well as update it as needed (when changes to course hours affect the units). Please note that it will take some time for Mary to add this info to existing courses (approx. 600 of them).
