DJ APOLLO is a hip-hop legend and musical pioneer who helped lay the foundation for the subculture known as turntablism. Born in the Philippines and raised in San Francisco, Apollo is a jack of all trades known for his many musical styles, from hip-hop to soul, funk, breaks, 80's and disco to name a few. He was one of the first DJs to experiment with the turntable as a musical instrument, which helped elevate the skill into an art form and turn the DJ into a musician. Because of this, he also became one of the first DJs to be a member of a live jazz band. DJ Apollo's radio show is broadcast Fridays and Saturdays at 9 p.m.–2 a.m. on 105.7 FM and 100.7 FM.

Ask-Me-Anything Booth

It's critical to get screened for Hepatitis B and bone marrow diseases. Learn more about these illnesses and how they impact a variety of ethnicities, including the Asian Pacific Islander community. The Asian American Donor Program (AADP) is part of the Be The Match Registry. As a 26-year-old non-profit organization, AADP helps blood cancer patients to find their bone marrow match. Because the markers used in matching are inherited, patients are more likely to match someone from their own race and ethnicity. As bone marrow donors need to be genetically matched, there is a higher chance of finding donor matches when looking in similar communities. Asian Liver Center at Stanford University reported that 1 in 10 Asian and Pacific Islanders is living with chronic Hepatitis B and most do not even know. The Asian Liver Center is encouraging testing. Complimentary refreshments.
