RE: Extended Opportunity Program & Services (EOPS) Demographics:
 2012 High School Graduates

Overview

EOPS student data was examined to determine the demographics of those who graduated from high school in 2012. Out of the 305 students who were identified as EOPS in Fall 2012, 16% are recent high school graduates (Table 1).

Table 2 shows the numbers of the 2012 high school cohort who were enrolled during the 2012-12 academic year. Three-fourths of these students were enrolled during the summer term and almost all were enrolled this winter term (94%).

About one-fourth of the EOPS students who graduated from high school in 2012 are Latina (25%) and this group makes up over half of all female students (55%). Within this cohort, Latino/as compose the largest ethnic group represented at 41%. The next largest ethnic group represented are White students, who are 18% of this cohort, followed by Asians (16%) and African Americans (14%). Table 3 shows the breakdown among each ethnic group by gender. With the exception of Latinos, more males are represented within each ethnic group.

At least 10% of EOPS students who graduated high school in 2012 attended Gunn High School (5 students) (Table 4). Los Altos, Menlo-Atherton, Mountain View and Sequoia High Schools represent the other top five institutions with the most EOPS students represented.
