RE: Early Summer Census by Student Population

## Overview

Early summer census data from June 18, 2013 were used to: 1) identify the student population groups represented in the online course offerings, and 2) determine the student population breakdown from the various zip code groupings. Table 1 shows that the percentage rate for all populations groups have increased except among continuing students (-11%). First-time transfer students increased from last year's early summer session (+5%), which represents the highest percentage rate change.

Table 2 shows that, except for those students from "San Mateo County Other," enrollment of first-time transfer students and first-time new students increased from all zip code groupings between last year's and this year's early summer session. Despite the decline in the number of continuing students enrolled in early summer session, there is a percentage rate increase among continuing students from "Cupertino, Sunnyvale, Los Altos, Mountain View, Palo Alto, Los Gatos and Saratoga" (34% in 2012 vs. 38% in 2013).
