RE:	Language Arts Division Enrollment, FTES and Productivity trends

## **Overview**

The trends in enrollment, full-time equivalent students (FTES) and productivity in the Language Arts Division were identified and disaggregated by department. Figures from Fall 2010 through Fall 2013 are examined to determine any changes in these indicators over time. Table 1 shows that the division's enrollment and FTES demonstrated an increasing trend between Fall 2010 and Fall 2012 (Table 1). Note that the 2013 data is not directly comparable to the other fall terms because the data are taken at a different point in the quarter.

Table 2 shows the changes in enrollment, FTES and productivity between the three fall terms (Fall 2010, Fall 2011 and Fall 2012) by department.

Within the division, ESLL enrollment and FTES demonstrated a downward trend over the last three fall quarters. Between Fall 2010 and Fall 2012, ESLL enrollment declined by 15% and ESLL FTES by 10%. Analysis of Fall 2010, Fall 2011 and Fall 2012 enrollment demonstrates roughly a 5-6% decline each year. Both JAPN and SPAN also experienced a fairly similar downward trend between Fall 2010 and Fall 2012.

In ENGL and HUMN, enrollment and FTES demonstrated an increasing trend over the past three fall quarters. ENGL enrollment increased by 14% between Fall 2010 and Fall 2011 and 10% between Fall 2011 and Fall 2012 while FTES increased by 14% and 9% during the same time periods. During the same period, HUMN enrollment increased by 30% between Fall 2010 and Fall 2011 and 18% between Fall 2011 and Fall 2012 and FTES increased by 27% and 14%. However, HUMN productivity declined by 22% between Fall 2010 and Fall 2012.

## **Methodology**

Data were identified based on the fall quarter census date with the exception for Fall 2013 (used September 16, 2013 data). Chinese, Creative Writing, French and Language Arts are excluded from these analyses, as these departments did not offer any courses after Fall 2011.
