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Spring 2013 to Summer 2013 NCP Enrollment and Concurrent Credit Enrollment RE:

Overview

Students who enrolled in Non-Credit Parenting (NCP) courses between Spring 2013 and Summer 2013 were identified to determine how many NCP courses they enrolled in and whether they enrolled in for credit courses. Table 1 shows that 376 students enrolled in a NCP course and at least half of these students enrolled in at least two NCP courses between Spring 2013 and Summer 2013 (54%). Only 1% of the students enrolled in NCP courses also enrolled in for credit courses during the same time period.

All NCP courses (400-403) were offered during these two academic terms; NCP 400 and NCP 401 was not offered in Summer 2013 (Table 2). The majority of all NCP enrollment in Spring 2013 and Summer 2013 was in NCP 403 (61%), followed by NCP 402 (18%) and NCP 401 (12%). NCP enrollment at the section level can be found in Appendix 1.

Table 3 expands on the data presented in Table 1 to show that over half of students enrolled in NCP during either Spring 2013 or Summer 2013 enrolled in two NCP courses (53%) while almost half enrolled in one NCP course (46%) (Table 3).

The credit courses taken by the five NCP students span five departments, making up a total enrollment of 15 over the two academic terms (Table 4). Roughly half of the enrollment was in CHLD (53%) with another one-fifth in CNSL (20%).

Overall course success rates among for credit courses taken by NCP students indicate they are successfully passing almost all of these courses (87%) (Table 5). The nonsuccess rate is from PHED 11A (nonsuccess) and HIST 17B (withdraw).

Almost three-fourths of the students enrolled in NCP courses are female (71%) while slightly over one-fourth are men (27%) (Table 6).

Table 7 shows the breakdown of NCP enrollment during Spring 2013 and Summer 2013 by age group. Half of the students are between ages 30 to 39 (50%) while another one-fourth are between ages 40 to 49 (24%). Those between the ages 20 and 24 are the smallest group represented (3%).

Latino/as are the largest ethnicity represented among NCP students during Spring 2013 and Summer 2013 (88%). All other ethnicities together represent a fraction of all students served (<10%) (Table 8).

The majority of NCP students' educational level are recorded as Special Admit or Unknown (63%). At least one-fourth of students have earned a high school equivalency (GED/HS diploma) (29%) (Table 9).

Table 10 shows that at least one-third of NCP students enrolled in Spring 2013 and Summer 2013 did not indicate or record their citizenship status (Table 10). Among students with citizenship information, half the students indicated U.S. Citizenship or Other Status (51%).

About one-third of NCP students enrolled in Spring 2013 and Summer 2013 reside in Mountain View (35%) while another one-fifth live in San Jose (19%) (Table 11) Other top cities of residence include Redwood City (16%) and Sunnyvale (11%).
