RE: CSU and UC transfer numbers

### Overview

Here are the 2010-11 California State University and University of California transfer numbers of Foothill College along with some of our neighboring colleges. Compared to these other institutions, Foothill transferred fewer numbers of students to the CSUs but a greater number to the UC system (Tables 1 & 2).

Among the CSU transfer students, these institutions sent the majority of their students to San Jose State University, San Francisco State University, and Cal State East Bay. Although Cabrillo had 45% of its CSU transfers enrolling at San Jose State University, Cal State Monterey Bay served as its second highest CSU transfer destination (19%). Due to proximity and its feeder school relationships, 57% of Chabot CSU transfer students attended Cal State East Bay and 59% of the College of San Mateo enrolled students at San Francisco State University. Both Evergreen and San Jose City College had a majority of its CSU transfer students attending San Jose State University (83% and 74% respectively).

UC Davis and UC Berkeley represent the top transfer destinations among these local community colleges. Cabrillo had 50% of its UC transfers attend UC Santa Cruz, and the College of San Mateo also had slightly more students transfer to UC Santa Cruz than Foothill (22 compared to 16).
