RE: 2012 Early Summer Session Census Report

Overview

Enrollment data for the early summer session was extracted at census (June 18, 2012). The figures show that there are 101 sections being offered, with an enrollment of 3,114. The number of FTES generated is 342. The figures suggest that most early summer session students are enrolled in one course only; the fact sheet shows that 99% of enrolled students are part-time and the average number of attempted units is five.


Table 2 shows the enrollment breakdown by division. Roughly half of the early summer enrollment and almost half of total sections offered are in BSS (1,508 for enrollment and 41 out of 101 sections). The majority of all early summer session courses are offered in an online format (84 out of 101; 83%).

Table 3 shows the enrollment trend for the early summer session. Most of the gains in FTES occurred during the first week (May 14-May19). The two dips that occur on May 25 and June 1 are due to drops for non-payment. After the first day of classes on June 11, there is a slight downward decline that appears to be leveling off.





It appears the majority of students enrolled in early summer session are residents (over 90%). The fact sheet shows that first-time transfers compose the largest group of students (37%) (compared to Fall 2011 where first-time transfers represent 14% of enrollment). Combined with the returning and continuing students, those with prior experience at Foothill or another college represent 89% of early summer students. New, first-time students (with no prior college experience) compose just 4% of those enrolled. Slightly over half of the enrolled students have earned a high school diploma as their highest level of education (56%) while 18% have earned a bachelor's degree or higher.
